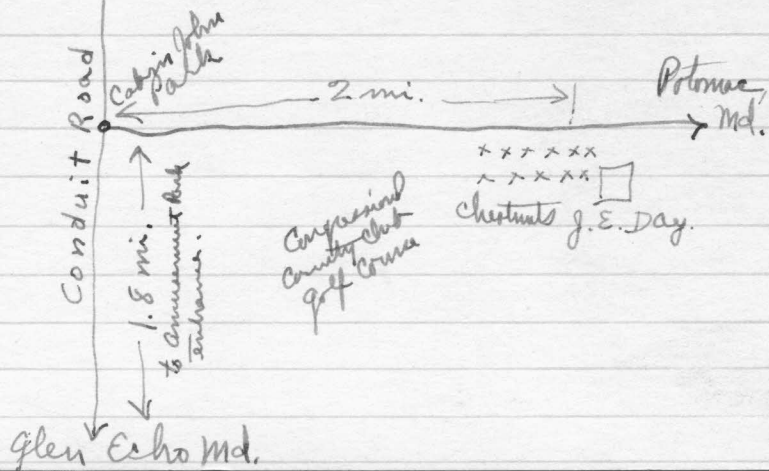

former he severed a sprout with roots or

The Japanese tree is about the same size and had but one burn this year and apparently too little pollen to act on the Chinese tree some distance away.

Bellamy desires a Chinese tree to set in the vicinity of the vegetative tree.

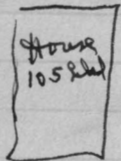

The tree was certainly partially killed back by the blight but whether the fungus did all the damage is not certain.

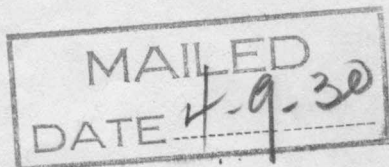

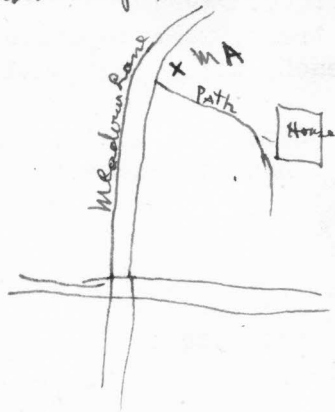

Tree #1, on the east side of walk, has the more upright growth; tree #2 on the west side of walk, is the larger tree; produced a few nuts in 1931 and a pint in 1932.

9/10/34 #1 tree is 20 ft. high, has 2 doz. burrs, will drop in a few days. Tree #2 is 25 ft. high; has 2 doz. burrs; CB at base on north side.

9/13/38 Trees again photographed by Purdy of Dept. (Compare with photos of 1933 and 1935). About 225 burrs on #1 tree and 300 burrs on #2 tree per Fowler, who collected 25 nuts from each for rating and planting. Nuts Tree #1 35 per lb.; nuts Tree #2 32 per lb. According to this data #1 produced about 1/6th bu. nuts and #2 about 1/3 bu. nuts. or twice as much.
