2. Provide impact analyses to the CJIS Executive Director for new or current systems.
3. Develop a calendar to implement policy or legislative changes.
4. Schedule and prioritize new initiatives.
5. Develop and recommend policy and legislative changes to the CJIS Governing Board.
6. Review and make recommendations on the CJIS budget to the CJIS Governing Board.

Technology Committee - Objectives

1. Set Architecture and technology standards based on resilience, scalability, flexibility and recovery. Review calendar for all technology standards lifecycle from cradle to grave. The committee should annually review lifecycle status for all CJIS technologies.
 - Adopt the GFIPM (Global Federated Identity and Privilege Management) standard for security.
 - Adopt the NIEM (National Information Exchange Model) standard for data.
 - Adopt the JIEM (Justice Information Exchange Model) standard for processes.
 - Adopt the JRA (Justice Reference Architecture) standard.
 - Set Positive Subject Identification standard.
 - Annually, review lifecycle status for all CJIS technologies.

Technology Committee - Objectives

2. Provide oversight to the CJIS Data Dictionary.
3. Validate the compliance of new projects with the Data Dictionary.
4. On an annual basis, review each project under the CJIS Governing Board's purview for compliance with technology standards.
5. Review the Data Model and ensure that it is being rationalized to meet our current needs.
6. Work together with the Administrative and Implementation Committees.
7. Maintain a CJIS technology portfolio management catalog.

Implementation Committee - Objectives

1. Initiate user groups for OBTS, CIDRIS, AFIS, and COLLECT.
2. Provide oversight to existing, new projects, or initiatives within the purview of the CJIS Governing Board.
3. To manage, maintain, and update a master project schedule for all interactions between agencies. This schedule will provide details on when, where, how, and why these interactions will occur so that each agency will be able to plan in advance for the changes.
4. To publish a quarterly status report on each project that is part of the master project schedule.
5. Ensure that JIEM information changes are updated on a yearly basis.
6. On an annual basis, validate CJIS data dictionary mapping.
7. Develop an Implementation issue resolution process.
