In accordance with Sections 10-283 and 10-283a of the Connecticut General Statutes, I hereby request authorization to enter into grant commitments for each project on the attached 2007 School Building Project Priority Category List. Each project has been placed into one of three priority categories as defined in Section 10-283. Individual project category placement has been determined by a review of the application and educational specifications submitted for each project.

Projects for permanent building additions and interior alterations have been reviewed for inclusion of technology infrastructure improvements. Unless otherwise noted in the Table 2 project description, a project does address technology.

Table 1 is an alphabetical listing of all projects, by category, including the amount of each estimated project grant. Table 2 is a brief description of each of the projects on the Priority List. Table 3 is a summary analysis of the Priority Lists for the current and past five years. Table 4 is a supplemental schedule of those projects previously approved by the Governor and the General Assembly for which costs or project scope have changed to a significant degree. In accordance with Section 9 of Public Act 06-158, projects seeking their first reauthorization have been presented on Table 4-1. Projects seeking their second reauthorization are presented on Table 4-2.

The project costs shown in these tables are estimated and are based upon preliminary documents. These documents generally include initial schematic designs and first cost estimates by architects based on such designs. While these costs should still be considered preliminary, we do require verification of the cost estimates by a qualified independent professional with experience in construction cost estimating. It typically takes three to six years from the time of preliminary estimates until projects are fully completed and final costs, on the basis of which final grant calculations are made, will be known. There are usually several changes from initial estimates to actual final costs, and therefore, estimates of both costs and associated grants are subject to change.

Prior to February 1 of each year, you are required by Section 10-283a to submit an approved or modified listing of priority projects to the Governor and General Assembly.


