



General Permit to Limit Potential to Emit from Major Stationary Sources of Air Pollution Re-registration Notification

The existing General Permit to Limit Potential to Emit from Major Stationary Sources of Air Pollution (GPLPE), which was issued on February 24, 2006, expires on February 24, 2011.
