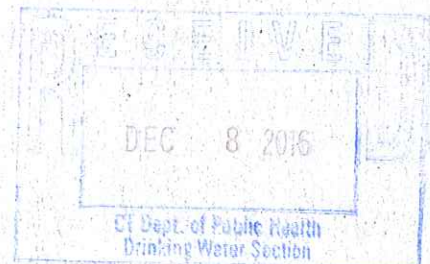
Measures for improving conservation by water utilities and other large private users is also a major priority.

Connecticut needs a water planning strategy that:


