












Pre-Harvest Sample Results for THC in %








THEFT OF HEMP PLANTS REPORTED

By Licensed Connecticut Growers



(HARTFORD, CT) - The Connecticut Department of Agriculture has received three reported incidents of theft from licensed hemp growers in Simsbury, North Stonington and Redding, CT. Reports include uprooting of plants and missing tops, totaling nearly 200 disturbed plants, or the equivalent of oneeighth of an acre.

- A. Agrees to comply with the provisions of Public Act 19-3 (the "Public Act"), the federal act (as defined in the Public Act), and DOAG Compliance Policy which are incorporated by reference
- B. The Conditional License Holder, as a condition of being granted a grower license, agrees to
- Acknowledge the Conditional License Holder shall comply with instructions from the Department and law enforcement agencies;
- Agree to pay the applicable licensing and inspection fees;
- Consent to entry onto, and inspection of all buildings, equipment, supplies, vehicles and records located on this real property where hemp or plants or materials are located, or licensed to be located, by the commissioner, and law enforcement agencies, at any time, with or without cause, and with or without advance notice;
- Comply with the criminal history records check requirements; and
- Consent to forfeit and destroy, without compensation:

Reporting Requirements

- ▶ Planting Report: Due within 15 days AFTER planting
- Harvest Report: Due before the Pre-Harvest Sample is collected
- Sample Results MUST be emailed to DOAG from the laboratory
- Post- Harvest Report: Due within 15 days AFTER harvesting




Fig. 1 - Example of a hemp seed label following the FSA
