Update: Sitecore 8.2 upgrade launched...and more!

Since the Sitecore 8.2 upgrade deployment on September 8th, the following items have been resolved:

- **Duplicate or Missing Content** Some users were seeing duplicates of pages or media library items or content updates not displaying on their website once published.
- Experience Editor Performance Content Authors and Approvers now experience improved speed performance when editing in the Experience Editor.

Other enhancements include:

- List Items Date Sorting Agencies now have the ability to sort items in a list order by date dependent on an accurate date field that can be filled out. Deployed on October 27th.
- Workflow Notifications System Administrators can now receive a notification each time a page is published through workflow, even if they are not part of that workflow. Deployed on October 27th.
- Agency Header Naming Agencies now have the ability to choose "Connecticut State" or "State of Connecticut" text for their agency header. This can be changed by the System Admin within the Agency Root, under the Agency Data CT Header section. Deployed on November 26th.

Update: Six new Agencies launched in Sitecore and six more to come!

As of October, six additional agencies have been migrated into the Sitecore system. If your agency links to documents or pages contained on any of these sites, you will want to update those links to the new location using the Internal Sitecore link.

- 1. <u>Department of Banking</u> (DOB)
- 2. Department of Revenue Services (DRS)
- 3. <u>Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection</u> (DESPP)
- 4. <u>Division of Emergency Management and Homeland Security</u> (DEMHS)
- 5. Police Officer Standards and Training Council (POST)
- 6. <u>Commission on Fire Prevention and Control</u> (CFPC)

The following Agencies are in the final phases of migrating into the Sitecore system and targeting to launch in January 2019.

Hot Topic: Linking an Anchor Link to another Page

An **Anchor Link** is a hyperlink on a page that, when clicked, jumps the visitor to a specific area on that same page or a different page. Inserting an anchor link requires two parts: creating the anchor and linking to the anchor.

Why are some links still routing to an old/deleted page even though the link was changed to point to a new page?

The parent folder will need to be published after deleting a page, changing the page's name, or moving a page or folder from one location to another.

Landing page List of Link items (Most Popular, Resources, etc.) are broken – throwing a wall of code when I
 Preview the page and appearing as a blank space on the live site.

The reason for the wall of code is because there are one or more incomplete/broken link items.

When editing a quick link or most popular link on the homepage, the link field must have a link inserted and the description and alt text fields filled out when the insertion dialogue box appears.
