# APPEARANCE BY JOSEPH CASSIDY, STATE BUILDING OFFICIAL:

Joseph Cassidy appeared and the Board expressed their concerns about inconsistencies within Connecticut towns regarding the approval of the installation of residential fire sprinkler systems, i.e. some towns will allow the installation of these systems and some will not. Towns are also inconsistent in that some require stamped prints or design schedules for 13D systems and some do not.

After discussion, Joe Cassidy informed the Board that any concerns over these inconsistencies among local building officials should be referred to the State Building Inspectors Office. He also confirmed that, although residential fire sprinkler systems are an *option* in the Code, they are not *required* according to the Code at this time. The Board and the State Building Inspectors Office will continue to work together toward the shared goal of educating the public and town officials on residential fire sprinkler systems.

# **APPEARANCE BY DCP COMMISSIONER JONATHAN A. HARRIS:**

Commissioner Jonathan A. Harris attended and informed the Board that DCP will be hiring a new director as part of a new enforcement unit. This unit will be housed within the Occupational/Professional Division under Director Richard M. Hurlburt and will include both occupational and home improvement enforcement.
