## **Legal Matters**

Opinion for Connecticut Pharmacy Commission on Caremark Pharmacy Proposal (see attached opinion)

There was discussion regarding Item #7 of the Draft Process; the concern was what would happen if the script was not picked up because a Pharmacy can not take back dispensed medication. Also, per 20-612, a clinic can not accept prescriptions from a pharmacy; in addition, it was found that a script can not be dropped off by a patient to a satellite for the clinic to fill.

#### Docket #: 07-31

Voluntary surrender of a Pharmacy Technician registration.

Commissioner Guynn moved, seconded by Commissioner Goodmaster and passed by a vote of (6-0) to accept the above-mentioned settlement agreement.

#### Docket #: 06-2950

The Drug Control Division investigated the theft of controlled substances from a pharmacy located in a grocery store.

Letter of reprimand was sent to the pharmacist because it appears the key was left unattended.

<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Guynn moved, seconded by Commissioner Beaudin and passed by a vote of (6-0) to accept the above-mentioned agreement.

Pharmacy Regulations update: It is being proposed that the current four-part Pharmacy exam be condensed to two-parts.

There is a public hearing scheduled for March 6, 2007; it is felt that one Commissioner should attend. Commission Guynn has agreed to attend.

#### Miscellaneous

Possible change of venue for the February 28, 2007 Commission of Pharmacy Meeting.

Because of a scheduled liquor hearing that may extend over a possible three day period, Room 126 may not be available. The Board Administrator will be informed prior to the meeting. The Old Judiciary Room in the State Capitol is the suggested alternative.

Pacific University of Oregon request for recognition of Pharm.D. Program

There was discussion with agreement that this is and PCPE issue and Pacific University of Oregon does not need to seek recognition for their Pharm.D. program from the Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy.
