The Friends of Camp Quinebaug provides funding for eleven camp counselor positions each summer. We also fund additional improvement projects at the camp. But to do this we need your help. We sponsor and engage in fundraising activities all year long to help raise these funds. Each year, the Friends rely on getting new members to assist with the many fundraising activities, socials, dances, dinners, races, walks, golf tournament, etc... If new members do not get involved with activities to raise these funds, or assist through tax deductible donations, the costs will fall solely on the families of the children who go to this special camp.
