## **Commissioner's Update**

- Commissioner Scheff updated the Council on the progress made, challenges that remain, and how DDS plans to reopen services while remaining committed to the safety of the individuals we serve.
  - o Thank you for the Council's kind remarks about my participation in Arc Town Hall
  - o More broadly, focused on Reopening Described reopening committees within DDS and provided updates on reopening guidelines regarding visitation, and employment and day services
  - o Can't let our guards down but need to mitigate the negative effects of isolation
  - o CT has done well when compared to other states
  - o Reviewed data trends, have been relatively flat since the 7th of June
- Kevin asked what the process is going to look like during reopening: o Providers are supposed to send plans by June 19.
  - o July 1 goal is 50% of regular attendance
  - o Date for day programs July 15th
- Neil Stein urged caution for the remaining threat of COVID-19
- Karen asked about shutting back down again if hospitalization rates increase o Shutting back down is a difficult decision that will be monitored closely. Many factors will be utilized to determine if this will be necessary in the future, including statewide and national case trends.
