November 2022 Monthly Report to the Council on Developmental Services

Assistance to Individuals and Families

In relation to my duties as Ombudsperson I worked with individuals, families, advocates, DDS, legislators, and outside agencies on numerous issues including:

- 1. Ongoing weekly support to family of individual transitioning from a CRS to self-direction.
- 2. Guardians rights and responsibilities for individuals who reside in group homes.
- 3. Issues between family members/guardians and private providers.
- 4. Mediation between family member/guardian & DDS Regional Center.
- 5. Support and information for siblings of adult individual with suspected ID who never applied for DDS.
- 6. Consultation with DDS Case Managers regarding family/guardian issues and complaints.
- 7. Information, referral, and outreach on behalf of individuals with autism and other disabilities who are not eligible for DDS funding & supports.
- 8. Issues between families and CCH providers.
- 9. Follow-up with DDS for individual in BSP seeking residential placement.
- 10. Family complaint about provider and DDS handling of individual who was removed from group for health & safety reasons.
- 11. Families seeking follow-up on hearing requests.
- 12. Collaboration with DDS and monitoring ongoing health and safety concerns due to unexplained injuries and multiple active investigations involving individual in a private group home.
- 13. Calls from legislators on constituent issues.
- 14. Issues around healthcare decisions/issues between provider and guardians.
- 15. Support for family in exploring residential support options.
- 16. Transportation issues.

Areas of Concern

- Impact of staffing crisis on access supports, person centered planning, advocacy, provider flexibility and quality of supports.
- Rights of families/guardians to provide advocacy and support for individuals who receive residential supports outside of the family home through DDS or private providers.
- Supporting, protecting and encouraging individual and family advocacy.
- Provider accountability.
- The lack of support options for individuals with autism and intellectual disabilities who are not eligible for DDS funding.
- Guardianship statistics in CT as compared to other states/ lack of information on alternatives to guardianship in Connecticut.
