# **Assistance to Individuals and Families**

In relation to my duties as Ombudsperson I worked with individuals, families, advocates, DDS, legislators, and outside agencies on numerous issues including:

- 1. Ongoing weekly support to family of individual transitioning from a CRS to self-direction. (1)

- 3. Mediation between family member/guardian & DDS Regional Center. (1)
- 4. Information, referral, and outreach on behalf of individuals who are not eligible for DDS funding & supports. (4)

- 6. Information, support, and collaboration with DDS for individual in BSP seeking residential placement. (1)
- 7. Questions about DDS eligibility. (5)
- 8. Families seeking follow-up on hearing requests. (4)
- 9. Collaboration with DDS regarding health and safety concerns due to unexplained injuries and multiple active investigations involving individual in a private group home. (1)

- 11. Assistance to Aging and Disability Services regarding DDS self-direction and DDS waivers.
- 12. Assistance and information to MA Ombudsperson.
- 13. Issues around healthcare decisions between provider and guardians. (1)
- 14. Consultation with DDS, referral, and support for parent of school aged son in BSP seeking residential support. (1)
- 15. Referral and information to people with autism and other disabilities on benefits and supports. (3)
- 16. Assistance to families in establishing a Parent/Guardian meeting at NW Regional Center. (1)
- 17. Family issues/ complaints/questions about abuse & neglect investigation process. (1)
- 18. Continued work with guardian & DDS to expand access and visitation for family members. (1)

## **Areas of Concern**

- Impact of staffing crisis on ability to access supports, person centered planning, advocacy, provider flexibility.
- Maintaining active family involvement, advocacy and support for individuals who receive residential supports outside of the family home through DDS or private providers.
- Supporting, protecting and encouraging individual and family advocacy.
- Provider, family, & guardian accountability.
- The lack of support options for individuals with autism and intellectual disabilities who are not eligible for DDS funding.
- Guardianship statistics in CT as compared to other states/ lack of information on alternatives to guardianship in Connecticut.
