## **Provider Description**

### Information provided by the provider describing their agency:

The Arc Eastern Connecticut is a grassroots non-profit agency established in 1952 by two groups of parents of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in order to ensure equal participation and choice in school, in the workplace, and in their communities. The Arc Eastern Connecticut provides advocacy and supports to over 800 people with IDD and their families in Windham and New London Counties and is the largest chapter of The Arc in the state. We have two administrative locations and provide a variety of programming based out of facilities in Groton, Woodstock, Norwich, Danielson, and 22 supported residences throughout the region. Our services touch every aspect of a person's life, including career planning, job training, supported employment, school-to-work transition, individualized day programs, in-home supports, supported apartments, and retirement services. Our micro-enterprise ventures throughout the region, in which people with IDD learn valuable skills that transfer to competitive employment, include culinary arts, lawn/landscape services, mobile cleaning services, a redemption center/donation station, and upscale thrift store. The Community Life & Advocacy program (CL&A) is the only program of its kind in the region, offering health/fitness activities (including Special Olympics), social/cultural programs, self-advocacy groups, civic participation, and personal enrichment activities. Our three major fundraisers are well-supported and anticipated community events: the Strides Road Race in October (now in its 45th year), our Murder Mystery Dinner (alternating with our Spring Film Festival in April), and the Gardner Johnson Memorial Golf Tournament in June.
