Every March, the National Association of Councils on Developmental Disabilities (NACDD) and its partners collaborate to observe <u>Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month</u> (DDAM). This year's theme, *Worlds Imagined*, focuses on how the world is changing as we move through and beyond the COVID-19 pandemic.

The social media campaign highlights the many ways in which people with and without disabilities come together to form strong, diverse communities. The campaign seeks to raise awareness about the inclusion of people with developmental disabilities in all aspects of community life, as well as awareness of the barriers that people with disabilities still sometimes face in connecting to the communities in which they live.





EDS Updates

Customized Employment (CE)

The CT Department of Developmental Services (DDS) has worked in conjunction with the CT Department of Aging and Disability Services (ADS) and the State Department of Education (SDE) to expand Customized Employment Services in Connecticut. The Connecticut Customized Employment Curriculum was developed by the Regional Educational Service Center (RESC) Alliance in consultation with all three state agencies.

The second training iteration is already in session and will end in May. The ADS-DDS team worked with training facilitators and students from the first iteration to revise the 2022 format of the CT CE Curriculum. The focus remains to build the capacity of existing CE providers and coverage for our job seekers statewide while addressing the time constraint concerns voiced by our first cohort of trainees.

The State of Connecticut Customized Employment Staff Registry is now complete. This registry will be used and monitored by ADS and DDS. <u>In order to provide CE services in the State of CT, staff must be listed on this registry.</u>

If you have a staff member who received an ACRE approved or State of Connecticut Customized Employment certificate, please have them complete the application to our registry.

CT DDS Employment Services Strategic Planning Committees

In February 2021, the State Employment Leadership Network (SELN) published their Finding & Observations Report on the State of Connecticut Department of Developmental Services Employment Services. Throughout the end of 2021, the committees established and began reviewing the different sections of the report. Seven sub-committees were created, each assigned to a different section of the report. A Steering Committee was created to organize the chairpersons and EDS Liaisons tasked with leading the sub-committees. The group was formally referred to as the "DDS SELN Strategic Planning Committee" but was renamed the "DDS Employment Services Strategic Planning Committee" to better reflect the focus of the group on employment services

1X Employment Incentives Survey


The Financing & Contracting Methods sub-committee has spent much time gathering information on the DDS One-time Employment Incentive that is used on an ISE or GSE path. The sub-committee created a survey for provider staff and DDS case managers, resource managers, and transition advisors to capture information about the usage of the incentive. The survey will be used to inform the sub-committee of questions, suggestions, problems, and successes with the 1X incentive.

Project SEARCH

CT now has **TEN** Project SEARCH host site/programs run by DDS provider agencies and school partners, with the newest program at Middlesex Hospital in Middletown now taking referrals for the next program year starting in September of

Project SEARCH is a nine-month internship training program, available to school transition age students and young adults eligible for DDS services, who need more intensive employment skills training. Many of the programs are <u>now accepting applicants</u> for the 2022/2023 program year which starts in September of 2022.
