Testimony Regarding Proposed DDS Five Year Plan 2022 – 2027

Commissioner Scheff and DDS Leadership team, thank you for providing this forum for input regarding the departments proposed five year plan from 2022 – 2027. Before I comment on the plan, I would like to take this opportunity to commend and thank the Department for its efforts during the ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic. As indicated in the accomplishments section, the Department in partnership with the private provider community have worked tirelessly to ensure the stability and availability of virtual services relied upon by individuals and families during this time. There is no doubt in my mind, our collective efforts have saved lives. Thank you!

After reviewing the plan, I am encouraged and supportive of the draft priorities outlined in each of the "domains" of the Charting the LifeCourse (CtLC) framework. While goals and objectives still need to be drafted for each domain, the plan provides an opportunity to continue stakeholder dialogue initiated through the "Seeds of Change" forums conducted last fall to prioritize and develop goals.

The goals and objectives or action steps for each priority will be dependent upon a number of variables in the future; including the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, projected DDS retirement "cliff"; staff recruitment & retention (both public & private sectors) and the stability of the private provider community.

Thankfully it is anticipated that funds via the American Rescue & Recovery Act will provide resources to recover from the pandemic and provide "seed" money to

best quality of care and outcome for the individuals supported by the department.

Throughout this entire process, communication among all stakeholders will be critical

to ensure the plan is a living, breathing document with FLEXIBLITY to ensure a vibrant
