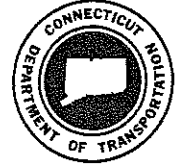

IN THE MATTER OF THE CITATION OF ACE PIANO MOVERS, INC.

FINAL DECISION

November 6, 2007

I. INTRODUCTION

A. General

By citation dated June 22, 2007 issued by the Department of Transportation (hereinafter "department"), pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-407, Ace Piano Movers, Inc. (hereinafter "respondent"), of Manchester, Connecticut, and holder of Certificate Number 1023, authorized to operate motor vehicles for the transportation of property for hire as a motor common carrier to all points in Connecticut from a headquarters in Manchester, was ordered to come before the department to answer allegations made therein.

The respondent was directed to appear at the Newington office of the Department of Transportation to show cause why Certificate Number 1023 should not be suspended, revoked or a civil penalty imposed for the violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c(b) for failure to make payment of annual fees for filing with the state proof of insurance.

The citation was sent to the respondent by first class and certified mail and recited the department's reasons for issuing same.

B. Hearing Held

Pursuant to Section 13b-407 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the public hearing for this citation was held on October 18, 2007.

Notice of the citation and of the hearing to be held thereon was given to the respondent and to such other parties as required by General Statutes Section 4-182 and 13b-407.

The hearing on this matter was conducted by a hearing officer designated by the Commissioner of Transportation, pursuant to Section 13b-17 of the General Statutes.

C. Appearances

The respondent failed to appear at the hearing.

Robert Colucci and Sheldon Lubin, with the Regulatory and Compliance Unit of the department presented the evidence and testified as a witness, respectively.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The respondent holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity (Number 1023), issued on March 12, 1979 by the department authorizing the transportation of household goods for hire as a household goods carrier in the State of Connecticut.

2. Each mover of household goods is required to renew its permit on a yearly basis, for the calendar year. Sheldon Lubin, utilities examiner with the Regulatory and Compliance Unit of the department was assigned to send permit renewal letters to the households goods moving companies.

3. Lubin sent such a letter to the respondent on October 24, 2006 and received no response from the respondent.

4. Lubin attempted to contact the respondent by telephone in January of 2007 and found that the telephone number was out of service.

5. The Office of the Secretary of the State records show that the respondent business as dissolved.

6. The respondent failed to appear at the hearing.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department of Transportation has the jurisdiction to determine matters dealing with the operation of any motor vehicle in the transportation of household goods for hire as a household goods carrier in the State of Connecticut. Section 13b-407 of the Connecticut General Statutes provides that the Commissioner of Transportation may revoke or suspend any certificate or permit for willful and repeated violations of any of the provisions of the Statutes or regulations governing the industry of transportation of household goods within the State of Connecticut.

The respondent is authorized under Certificate Number 1023 to transport household goods within the State of Connecticut. The respondent failed to file its annual certificate of proof of insurance and the intention to continue business, as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c(b). The respondent's state business filing with the Office of the Secretary of the State shows the business to be dissolved. The respondent's telephone is not in service. The evidence supports the conclusion that the respondent is no longer in business.

IV. ORDER

Based on the above, Certificate Number 1023, standing in the name of Ace Piano Movers, Inc., is hereby revoked, said revocation to become effective fifteen (15) days from the date of this Final Decision.
