

RE: IN THE MATTER OF THE CITATION OF MARRONE MOVING AND STORAGE, LLC.

Final Decision

November 9, 2007



#### I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

#### A. General

By citation dated June 25, 2007, by the Department of Transportation (hereinafter "Department"), pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-407, as amended, Marrone Moving and Storage, LLC (hereinafter "respondent"), holder of Certificate Number 1626, was ordered to come before the Department to answer the allegations made therein.

Pursuant to said citation, the respondent was directed to appear at the Newington office of the Department of Transportation to show cause why Certificate Number 1626, issued for the operation of a household goods motor carrier, should not be suspended or revoked or a civil penalty imposed for violation of its certificate pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410.

More specifically, it is alleged that on December 31, 2006, the certificate holder failed to file a 2007 annual intrastate permit fee for each vehicle that such household goods motor carrier intends to operate under authority of the Connecticut Department of Transportation in violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c(b).

The citation was served upon the respondent at 11 Pawcatuck Avenue, P.O. Box 1331, Pawcatuck, Connecticut by first class and certified mail and recited the department's reasons for issuing it.

#### B. Hearing Held

Pursuant to Section 13b-410 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, the public hearing for this citation was held on October 30, 2007.

Notice of the citation and the hearing to be held thereon was given to the respondent and to such other parties as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, as amended.

The hearing on this matter was conducted by a hearing officer designated by the Commissioner of Transportation, pursuant to Section 13b-17 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

#### C. Appearances

No one appeared on behalf of the respondent, Marrone Moving and Storage, LLC. The respondent's mailing address is 11 Pawcatuck Avenue, P.O. Box 1331, Pawcatuck, Connecticut 06379.

Wayne Sinclair, with the Regulatory and Compliance Unit, presented the department's case in this matter. Sheldon Lubin acted as a witness.

#### II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The respondent is the holder of Certificate 1626 in the name of Marrone Moving and Storage, LLC and has been authorized to operate as a household goods motor carrier from a headquarters in Pawcatuck.
- 2. On October 24, 2006, Sheldon Lubin sent a letter to the respondent asking for intrastate permit fees to be paid by December 31, 2006.

- 3. On December 31, 2006, the certificate holder failed to file a 2007 annual intrastate permit fee for each vehicle that such household goods motor carrier intended to operate under authority of the Connecticut Department of Transportation in violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c(b).
- 4. A Notice of Hearing was sent to the respondent on June 25, 2007 at 11 Pawcatuck Avenue, P.O. Box 1331, Pawcatuck, Connecticut 06379.
- 5. The Notice of Hearing was returned to the Department stamped "Not deliverable as addressed, Unable to forward".
  - 6. The respondent failed to appear at the citation hearing on October 30, 2007.

### III. <u>DEPARTMENT ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW</u>

The Department of Transportation has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the operation of household goods operators in the State of Connecticut accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, as amended.

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, the Department may amend or for sufficient cause suspend or revoke any such permit. Further, the Department may impose a civil penalty on any person who violates any provision of the governing chapter or any regulation adopted under Section 13b-389 through 13b-415, as amended, with respect to fares, service, operation or equipment, in an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars per day for each violation.

The Department tried on numerous occasions to contact the respondent by mail or phone without success. The respondent failed to file its annual permit fees. Since the respondent failed to appear at the hearing, respondent's certificate will be revoked.

#### IV. <u>ORDER</u>

Based on the above, Certificate Number 1626, standing in the name of Marrone Moving and Storage, LLC is hereby revoked. The revocation shall become effective fifteen (15) days from the date of this final decision.

This final decision constitutes notice in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 4-182(c).
