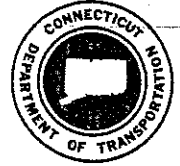

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Bureau of Finance and Administration, 2800 Berlin Turnpike, Newington, Connecticut, on Tuesday, August 9, 2011 at 10:00 a.m. in Conference Room A on Docket No. 1102-GOV-4-L for the application of Executive 2000 Transportation, LLC.

Pursuant to the provisions of 13b-103 and 4-177 thru 182 Connecticut General Statutes (C.G.S.) Executive 2000 Transportation, LLC. seeks authorization to operate two (2) motor vehicles, each having a passenger seating capacity of ten (10) adults or less, for service under contract with any federal, state or municipal agency, or a lower tier contract thereof, from a headquarters in Cromwell.

The applicant is currently authorized to operate nine (9) motor vehicles in governmental contract service under Livery Permit No. 2820.

Pursuant to Section 4-177a of the Connecticut General Statutes, any person may request party status, if such person has submitted a written petition to the agency and mailed copies to all parties, at least five (5) days before the date of the hearing and the petition states facts that demonstrate that the petitioner's legal rights, duties or privileges shall be specifically affected by the agency's decision in the contested case.

In addition, any person may request intervenor status if such person has submitted a written petition to the agency and mailed copies to all parties, at least five (5) days before the date of the hearing and the petition states facts that demonstrate that the petitioner's participation is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly conduct of the proceedings.
