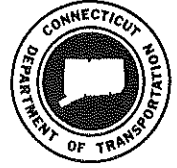

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the Bureau of Finance and Administration, 2800 Berlin Turnpike, Newington, Connecticut, on April 14, 2020 at 10:00 AM in Conference Room A on Docket No. 2002-C-15-HG for the application of Xcelerate Moving, Inc.

The records of the Department indicate you are the holder of Household Goods Carrier Certificate Number HG1797. The records of the Department further indicate that you are in violation of the following Connecticut General Statutes (CGS) and/or Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies:

CGS Section 13b-410b (Regulations re payment of annual fees for filing proof of insurance by motor carriers) & Sec. 13b-410c (Intrastate household goods carrier certificate) and State Regulation 16-304-F24 (List of Vehicles operated) and 16-304-D1 (Insurance required), as amended, by violating the terms of the Certificate which require the Certificate holder to comply with all pertinent laws and other statutes, and/or rules, regulations and orders of the department.

More specifically, on January 1, 2020, it came to the attention of the department that Xcelerate Moving, Inc. did not renew its Household Goods Carrier Certificates, did not provide a list of vehicles operated, and did not provide a form E proof of insurance. As a result, the respondent is subject to a hearing and a fine of \$500.00 pursuant to CGS 13b-414, and CGS 13b-407 and possible revocation of your certificate.

Pursuant to Section 4-177a of the Connecticut General Statutes, any person may request party status, if such person has submitted a written petition to the agency and mailed copies to all parties, at least five (5) days before the date of the hearing and the petition states facts that demonstrate that the petitioner's legal rights, duties or privileges shall be specifically affected by the agency's decision in the contested case.

In addition, any person may request intervenor status if such person has submitted a written petition to the agency and mailed copies to all parties, at least five (5) days before the date of the hearing and the petition states facts that demonstrate that the petitioner's participation is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly conduct of the proceedings.

All petitions for party or intervenor status must be submitted in written form and received by this department no later than five (5) days prior to the date of hearing. Otherwise, such requested status shall be subject to denial. The five-day requirement may be waived at any time before or after the commencement of the hearing on a showing of GOOD CAUSE. Copies of any requests for party or intervenor status must be mailed to the applicant and to all known parties.

An original and **FOUR (4) COPIES** of all prepared documents and exhibits intended to be introduced as evidence in this matter by the applicant, party, or intervenor must be filed with the department no less than **SEVEN (7) DAYS** prior to the date of hearing. All filings must be mailed to:


