RE: APPLICATION OF VJONES ENTERPRISE LLC TO OPERATE ONE (1) MOTOR VEHICLE IN GENERAL LIVERY SERVICE, WITH A SEATING CAPACITY OF LESS THAN ELEVEN PASSENGERS, FROM A HEADQUARTERS IN NORWALK

DECISION

AUGUST 1, 2023

I. INTRODUCTION

A. APPLICATION

By application filed on June 13, 2022, with the Department of Transportation (hereinafter "department"), pursuant to Section 13b-103 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, Vjones Enterprise LLC (hereinafter "applicant") with a mailing address of 41 Kettle Road, Norwalk, Connecticut 06850 seeks authorization to operate one (1) motor vehicle, having a seating capacity of less than eleven (11) passengers, in general livery service from a headquarters in Norwalk.

B. HEARING

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103, as amended, a public hearing by telephone was held on this application on July 25, 2023.

Notice of the application and of the hearing to be held thereon was given to the applicant and to such other parties as required pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103, as amended. Legal notice to the public was given by publication on the department's website.

A hearing officer designated by the Commissioner pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-17 conducted the hearing on this matter.

C. APPEARANCES

Jones Mongerard appeared pro se on behalf of the applicant. The applicant's mailing address is 41 Kettle Road, Norwalk, Connecticut 06850.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The applicant seeks to operate one (1) motor vehicle in general livery service from a headquarters in Norwalk.
- 2. The applicant proposes to operate a 2012 Ford E250 van. This vehicle will be purchased outright.
- 3. The applicant has been working as a Connecticut Transit bus driver for the past year and as substitute school bus driver.
- 4. The applicant's first six months of expenses includes property tax of \$180, vehicle purchase price of \$16,900, insurance of \$6,952, maintenance of \$2,000, advertising costs of \$50 and

communication costs of \$360.

- 5. The applicant has \$29,042 in a business bank account.
- 6. The applicant will drive the livery vehicle himself.
- 7. The applicant will be operating the livery business out of his residence.
- 8. The applicant has sisters who work as nurses and a girlfriend who is a social worker. He feels that they will be able to provide him livery referrals.
 - 9. This application was not opposed.

III. DISCUSSION

The department has jurisdiction over each person, association, limited liability company or corporation owning or operating a motor vehicle in livery service, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-102, as amended.

In determining whether a livery permit should be granted, the department shall take into consideration the present or future public convenience and necessity. The applicant must prove that the public's convenience and necessity will be improved by the proposed service. Additionally, the applicant must show the suitability of the applicant or the suitability of the management if the applicant is a limited liability company or corporation, the financial responsibility of the applicant, the ability of the applicant efficiently and properly to perform the service for which authority is requested and the fitness, willingness and ability of the applicant to conform to the provisions of the statutes and the requirements and regulations of the department thereunder, in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-103.

Regarding the applicant's suitability, the applicant submitted a criminal record check for Jones Mongerard which disclosed no criminal record. The applicant has been working as a school bus driver and as a Connecticut Transit driver. Based on the evidence presented, the applicant is suitable to conduct the proposed intrastate livery business.

As far as the applicant's financial ability is concerned, the applicant presented evidence of the first six months of expenses which includes property tax of \$180, vehicle purchase cost of \$16,900, insurance of \$6,952, maintenance costs of \$2,000, advertising costs of \$50 and communication costs of \$360 for a total expense of \$26,442. The applicant has \$29,042 in a bank account to cover these startup expenses and is therefore financially suitable.

On the issue of public convenience and necessity, the applicant is seeking to operate a livery service as the result of making driving his chosen profession. The applicant believes his

Based on the evidence presented, the applicant has shown that public convenience and necessity will be improved by a grant of this application.

IV. ORDER

Based upon the above and pursuant to Connecticut General Statute Section 13b-103, as amended, the application in the name of Vjones Enterprise LLC is hereby granted, and Livery Permit Number 3796 is hereby issued as follows:

LIVERY PERMIT NUMBER 3796

Vjones Enterprise LLC is authorized to operate one (1) motor vehicle in general livery service, with a seating capacity of less than eleven passengers, from a headquarters in Norwalk.

RESTRICTIONS:

The applicant must register and insure the one (1) general livery vehicle granted in this decision within ninety (90) days. Failure to do so may result in revocation of the general livery authority.

The authority granted under this permit may not be sold or transferred until it has been operational, i.e. a vehicle registered with livery plates thereunder for not less than twenty-four (24) months.

This permit shall remain in effect until it is amended, suspended or revoked by the department. Failure of the permit holder to maintain proper insurance and/or comply with all pertinent motor vehicle laws and other state statutes and/or rules, regulations and orders of the department shall be considered sufficient cause to amend, suspend or revoke said permit.

A memorandum of this permit, bearing the seal of the department, shall be

conspicuously posted in each motor vehicle operated under this permit.
