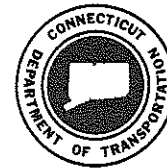

FINAL DECISION

August 8, 2012

I. INTRODUCTION

A. General

By citation dated May 9, 2012, by the Department of Transportation (hereinafter "department"), pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c(b) as amended, G and G Enterprises ("respondent"), holder of Certificate Number 1750, was ordered to come before the department to answer the allegations made therein.

Pursuant to said citation, the respondent was directed to appear at the Newington office of the Department of Transportation to show cause why Certificate Number 1750, issued for the operation of a household goods motor carrier, should not be suspended or revoked or a civil penalty imposed for violation of its household certificate pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410.

More specifically, it is alleged that on December 31, 2011, the certificate holder failed to file a 2012 annual intrastate permit fee for each vehicle that such household goods motor carrier intended to operate under authority of the Connecticut Department of Transportation in violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c (b).

The citation was served upon the respondent at 188 Cleveland Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut 06120 by first class and certified mail and recited the department's reasons for issuing it.

B. Hearing Held

Pursuant to Section 13b-410 of the Connecticut General Statutes, as amended, the public hearing for this citation was held on August 2, 2012.

Notice of the citation and the hearing to be held thereon was given to the respondent and to such other parties as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, as amended.

The hearing on this matter was conducted by a hearing officer designated by the Commissioner of Transportation, pursuant to Section 13b-17 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

C. Appearances

No one appeared on behalf of the respondent, G and G Enterprises. The respondent's mailing address is 188 Cleveland Avenue, Hartford, Connecticut 06120.

Dennis King, Manager of the Regulatory and Compliance Unit, presented the department's case in this matter.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The respondent is the holder of Certificate 1750 in the name of G and G Enterprises.

2. In October 2011, the department sent a letter to the respondent asking for intrastate permit fees to be paid by December 31, 2011.

3. On December 31, 2011, the certificate holder failed to file a 2012 annual intrastate permit fee for each vehicle that such household goods motor carrier intended to operate under authority of the Connecticut Department of Transportation in violation of Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410c (b).

4. A Notice of Hearing was mailed on May 9, 2012 for a hearing to be held on August 2, 2012.

5. The Notice of Hearing was claimed and returned to the department on May 11, 2012.

6. The respondent failed to appear at the citation hearing on August 2, 2012.

III. DEPARTMENT ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Department of Transportation has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the operation of motor vehicles in household goods service in the State of Connecticut accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, as amended.

Pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes Section 13b-410, the Department may amend or for sufficient cause suspend or revoke any such permit. Further, the Department may impose a civil penalty on any person who violates any provision of the governing chapter or any regulation adopted under Section 13b-389 through 13b-415, as amended, with respect to fares, service, operation or equipment, in an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars per day for each violation.

The respondent failed to file its intrastate permit application and fee for 2012 as required. Since the respondent failed to appear at the hearing, respondent's certificate will be revoked.


IV. ORDER

Based on the above, Certificate Number 1750, standing in the name of G and G Enterprises is hereby revoked. The revocation shall become effective fifteen (15) days from the date of this final decision.

This final decision constitutes notice in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes Section 4-182(c).
