SUMMARY OF THE JANUARY 2000 SUPPLEMENTAL SPECIFICATIONS TO THE STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FORM 815

The most recent significant changes are summarized below:

- Supplemental Specification 101 adds two (2) new definitions to clarify the difference between "Equal" and "Substitute". It also adds the abbreviation for CSI (Construction Specifications Institute) which is used extensively on Facilities projects.
- Supplemental Specification 103 adds language to correct insurance terminology to comply with industry language. It also incorporates the State of Connecticut as an additional insured party for all applicable coverage's and includes language and requirements regarding Excess/Umbrella Insurance.
- Supplemental Specification 104 addresses changes in the Contract by providing a procedure to ensure that the Inspector has the necessary information regarding financial and scheduling impacts due to the changes.
- Supplemental Specification 105 adds language to indicate enlarged details take precedence over other data on the plans.
- Supplemental Specification 106 clarifies that the Contractor is responsible for testing, certificates, and inspections contained within the Special Provision. It also adds the language from Section 101 above concerning "equal".
- Supplemental Specification 107 expands the language to include maintaining the public right-of-way for Facilities type projects, as well as expanding the language on limitations on locations for storing materials and established work areas. It also places the burden on the Contractor for maintaining and protecting its work and storage areas. Finally, it includes language to address both highway and facilities projects.
- Supplemental Specification 109 revises the value of consideration for Value Engineering Proposals from a total contract savings of \$40,000 to \$200,000. In addition, language is added to make the Contractor justify prices for specialized work. Also, language is provided to clarify the DOT's right to eliminate sub-items from the lump sum building item without effecting the project. Finally, language is provided to update how stored materials are paid for.
- Supplemental Specification 980 incorporates the requirement of reestablishing existing pavement markings after a roadway has been overlaid or milled.
