INTRODUCTION

David Lavoie, LLC dba Honor Movers (hereinafter “applicant”), is the holder of Certificate Number HG1793, last issued by the Department of Transportation (hereinafter “Department”) on December 4, 2017, authorizing them, subject to such regulations and conditions as the Department from time to time may prescribe, to operate motor vehicles in the transportation of household goods for hire, as a household goods carrier, over irregular routes between all points in Connecticut upon calls received from a headquarters in Killingly.

II. APPLICANT’S PROPOSAL

By Application Number 2012-TH-65-HG, filed on December 1, 2020, the applicant seeks Department approval to transfer its headquarters from Killingly to Putnam.

III. APPLICANT’S STATEMENT OF JUSTIFICATION

The applicant wishes to move their business to be closer to their customer base.

IV. FINDINGS OF FACT

It appears that by Department grant of the instant application, the applicant will be in a better position to operate a more efficient service for all concerned parties, thereby best satisfying the needs of public convenience and necessity.

V. CONCLUSION

Therefore, based upon the facts stated above, and pursuant to Section 16-304-F4 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, the Department hereby approves the transfer of headquarters of the authority granted under Certificate Number HG1793 as proposed, from Killingly to Putnam, and Certificate Number HG1793 is hereby amended and reissued in the following form:

David Lavoie, LLC dba Honor Movers is hereby certified and authorized, subject to such regulations and conditions as the Department may from time to time prescribe, to transport property for hire as a motor common carrier over irregular routes as follows:

Household goods, within the State of Connecticut, between all points upon calls received at its headquarters in Putnam.

The certificate holder must accept and transport property, as herein authorized and in accordance with its tariff on file, for all persons who desire the service to the extent of the certificate holder’s facilities at uniform rate for all similar service.

There shall be carried in each vehicle operated under this authority, a copy of the certificate registration receipt by the Department.

The certificate shall remain in effect until suspended, amended or revoked by the Department. Failure of the certificate holder to maintain proper insurance or to comply with all motor vehicle laws and other State statutes and/or rules, regulations and orders of the Department shall be considered sufficient cause to revoke said certificate.

This certificate is transferrable only with the approval of the Department and is issued subject to compliance by the holder thereof with all motor vehicle laws of the State of Connecticut, and with such rules regulations and orders as this Department may from time to time prescribe.

A memorandum of this certificate, bearing the seal of the Department, shall be kept conspicuously posted in the motor vehicles operated hereunder.
