Another grant to purchase signs and deploy DOT does not approve the installation of the signs as proposed, NVCOG position is that the signs should be installed

Where are the signs proposed? Both Limited access highways, bottoms of ramps and then reinforcing of location on state roads

Attractions signs – state needs policy?

DOT says they do not consider a trail to be an attraction that can be signed as an attraction. NVCOG asserts that a multi-use trail is a transportation facility – is not defined as an attraction – it is a facility

Board noted that these trails are signed as attractions in other states

Highway marking where there is an intersection

Statewide signs – standardized for trails?

Want a policy that recognizes multi-use paths of regional significance – ought to be considered for signage

DOT willing to post signs for trail crossing a state roadway

Discussion on need for a policy on the trail signs across state

Board suggests the CTDOT consider a policy for the signs state-wide – Sandy will contact Mark Carlino to request a meeting so that we can better understand the issues from the DOT persepective and can explore possible solutions.
