Business Licensing/Permitting and Certification

- Secretary of the State Commercial Recording Division files and maintains legally required records showing the formation of and fundamental changes to corporations, limited liability companies, limited liability partnerships, limited partnerships and other businesses (https://www.concord-sots.ct.gov/CONCORD/).
- Connecticut Economic Resource Center (CERC) provides free online information about the state's business registration requirements. Business can find information on what you need to do to set up a new or relocated business in Connecticut and who can help them with this process (https://www.cerc.com/).

Women-owned business certification

SBE/MBE Program Certification Application (Small or Minority Business Enterprise) — Through this certification program, the State of Connecticut strives to help women business owners capitalize on more opportunities to do business with the state government and its agencies (https://portal.ct.gov/DAS/Procurement/Supplier-Diversity/SBE-MBE-Program-Certification-Application-Small-or-Minority-Business-Enterprise).



Access to Capital

- Small Business Express Program. If you've been in business for at least a year and employ fewer than 100 people, we encourage you to explore the funding opportunities offered through the state's Small Business Express program (https://portal.ct.gov/DECD/Content/Business-Development/05_Funding_Opportunities/Small-Business-Express).
- Minority Business Initiative. This public-private program is specifically designed to help minority-owned businesses access the funding, technical assistance and public contracting resources they need to build and grow a successful business (https://portal.ct.gov/DECD/Content/Business-Development/01_Type_of_Business/Minority-Owned-Businesses).
- Small Business Administration (SBA) Loans Guarantees. The SBA works with lenders to provide loans to small businesses. The agency doesn't lend money directly to small business owners. Instead, it sets guidelines for loans made by its partnering Lenders, community development organizations, and micro-lending institutions. The SBA reduces risk for lenders and makes it easier for them to access capital. That makes it easier for small businesses to get loans (https://www.sba.gov/funding-programs/loans).
- Connecticut Innovations. Provides early-stage companies with venture capital and debt financing along with strategic guidance and connections to a valuable network of partners and resources to support your company success (https://ctinnovations.com/)
