

STUDENT LOAN REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

What is it?

In 2024, the General Assembly approved the development of a [Student Loan Reimbursement Program](#), a \$6 million program aimed at providing financial relief to Connecticut residents burdened with student loan debt. Applicants will be awarded on a first-come first-serve basis and receive up to \$5,000 a year with a \$20,000 cap over four years.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must be current Connecticut residents and have lived in the state for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years immediately prior to the date on their application.

Applicants must have an outstanding student loan balance, and during 2024 have paid toward a federal direct loan, federal direct PLUS loan, federal Perkins loan, CHESLA loan or other state-sponsored student loan. Student loan statements must include the borrower's name and account number, and the loan history must indicate individual payments submitted during 2024. Please enter the total **dollar** amount of payments submitted on the application, not the number of payments.

Applicants must have graduated from a Connecticut public or private college or university with an undergraduate - associates or bachelor's degree - or have earned an occupation/professional license or certificate.* Graduate degrees are not a qualifying document for this program. Transcripts are not acceptable unless a student has graduated in December 2024.

Applicants must have a Connecticut adjusted gross income of not more than \$125,000 for single applicants, or \$175,000 for married applicants in 2023.

Applicants must have volunteered for at least 50 hours after January 1, 2024. These hours must be completed at a [Connecticut Nonprofit Organization](#) - including serving on its Board of Directors, in municipal government, or through military service. Proof of volunteer documentation must be notarized.

Application Process

The Office of Higher Education, in partnership with its contracted IT specialist, NELNET, is developing a Student Loan Reimbursement Program (SLRP) program within the agency's **CT SCHOLARS** portal. On January 1, 2025, applicants may begin their application by navigating to the **CT SCHOLARS** portal where they'll be instructed to create an account, complete an application and upload required **documents** for acceptance consideration.
