Project Description: Jefferson Radiology, PC ("Applicant") requests a waiver of Certificate of Need requirements for replacement equipment for the purpose of replacing its existing 4-slice computed tomography ("CT") scanner with a 16-slice CT scanner at its office located at 6 Northwestern Drive in Bloomfield, Connecticut. The total capital cost associated with the replacement equipment project is \$410,128.

Nature of Proceedings: On May 4, 2010, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") received the completed waiver of Certificate of Need ("CON") request for replacement equipment from Jefferson Radiology, P.C. ("Applicant"). The Applicant proposes to replace its existing 4-slice computed tomography ("CT") scanner with a 16-slice CT scanner at its office located at 6 Northwestern Drive in Bloomfield, Connecticut. The total capital cost associated with the replacement equipment project is \$410,128.

OHCA's authority to review and approve, modify or deny the requested waiver of CON requirements for replacement equipment is established by Section 19a-639c of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S."), as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96. The provisions of

this section as well as Section 19a-639, C.G.S. and the principles and guidelines set forth in Section 19a-637, C.G.S., were fully considered by OHCA in its review.

Findings of Fact

- On November 5, 2009, Jefferson Radiology, P.C. ("Applicant") received a Certificate of Need ("CON") from the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") under Docket Number: 09-31322-CON to acquire a 4-slice computed tomography ("CT") scanner and a magnetic resonance imaging ("MRI") scanner as part of physician practice merger in Bloomfield, Connecticut. (May 4, 2010, Initial Submission of CON Waiver Form 2040, Attachment
- 2. Pursuant to Section 19a-639c of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S") as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96, a proposal may be eligible for a waiver of replacement equipment from the CON process when a provider previously received a CON for the equipment to be replaced, and the expenditure or value of the replacement equipment is less than \$3 million. (Section 19a-639c, C.G.S., as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96)
- 3. The total capital cost for the replacement equipment proposal is \$410,128, which is entirely attributable to the cost of the replacement CT scanner. (May 4, 2010, Initial Submission of CON Waiver Form 2040, page 4 and Attachment B)
- 4. The replacement equipment value is below the \$3 million threshold used to determine whether a request is eligible to receive a waiver of CON requirements for replacement equipment pursuant to Section 19a-639c, C.G.S., as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96. (Section 19a-639c, C.G.S., as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96)

Rationale

Jefferson Radiology, P.C. ("Applicant") is requesting a waiver of Certificate of Need ("CON") requirements for replacement equipment pursuant to Section 19a-639c of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S.") as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96. The Applicant is seeking to replace its existing 4-slice computed tomography ("CT") scanner with a 16-slice CT scanner at its office located at 6 Northwestern Drive in Bloomfield, Connecticut

On November 5, 2009, the Applicant received a CON authorization from the Office of Health Care Access under Docket Number: 09-31322-CON to acquire a 4-slice CT scanner in conjunction with a physician practice merger in Bloomfield, Connecticut.

The replacement equipment cost for the proposed 16-slice CT scanner is \$410,128, which is below the \$3 million threshold for determining eligibility for a waiver of CON requirements for replacement equipment pursuant to Section 19a-639c, C.G.S., as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96.

Order

Based on the foregoing Findings and Rationale, the Office of Health Care Access ("OHCA") has determined that the request of Jefferson Radiology, PC ("Applicant") for a waiver of Certificate of Need ("CON") requirements in order to replace its existing 4-slice computed tomography ("CT") scanner with a CT scanner at its office located at 6 Northwestern Drive in Bloomfield, Connecticut, at a replacement equipment cost of \$410,128, meets the requirements for waiver of the CON process pursuant to Section 19a-639c of the Connecticut General Statutes ("C.G.S.") as amended by Public Act: 09-232, Section 96, and is hereby approved, subject to the following condition.

1. This authorization requires the removal of the Applicant's existing 4-slice CT scanner for certain disposition, such as sale or salvage, outside of and unrelated to the Applicant's Connecticut service locations by no later than six months after the replacement CT scanner has become operational.

Should the Applicant fail to comply with the aforementioned condition, OHCA reserves the right to take additional action as authorized by law. All of the foregoing constitutes the final order of the Office of Health Care Access in this matter.
