- Discussed standards and guidelines in several states to assist with our discussions. (Alaska, Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, Michigan, Mississippi, New Hampshire, and West Virginia)

Ambulatory Surgery Centers

- OHCA would like the standards and guidelines to address:
 - Service Area
 - Capacity
 - Utilization
 - Requirements to add a new ASC
 - Physician Referral Patterns
 - Time/Distance to Hospital
 - OR definition
 - Requirements to add additional ORs
 - Exceptions

Ambulatory Surgery Centers

- The Subcommittee developed draft recommendations which included:
 - Background on ambulatory surgical care and recent statutory changes
 - Surgical Trend Information
 - A Facility Location Map-hospital and ASC/HOPD
 - Specific Recommendations designed to enhance the 9 general guidelines and principles currently included in C.G.S. 19a-639
 - Incorporating quality standards and safety initiatives
 - Identified key areas which present problems for standardization, including:
 - Service Area, Capacity, Utilization
 - Further Discussion in these areas
